



Greeting fellow Lions,

Wow, a quarter of the Lion year has already come and gone! As you may know the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum was September 21 – 23 in Reno, NV. Several Lions from Multiple District 38 (Nebraska) attended, and participated in sessions ranging from training upcoming leadership, running good meetings, to membership recruitment and retention. Overall, it was fun filled time, with inspirational speakers, and a lot of good information those Lions will be able to share with their local clubs. If you have not attended a forum before I would encourage you to attend one to experience the energy of your fellow Lions, and to see how we are part of a much larger organization than just our local clubs or even state. Next year's forum will be in Louisville, KY.

While at the forum International President, Dr. Patti Hill, talked about her theme of "Changing the World." She discussed four goals to strive for to help us change the world. First, she wants us all to Reach our Service Potential. Part of this is to increase our membership so we can do more with more hands to help out. With more help we can look at the diverse needs in our clubs and communities and complete more club projects.

Second, she challenged us to Create a Greener, Cleaner Environment. This can be done in many different ways. At the forum they discussed the program where clubs and communities can collect plastic bags and turn them in. Once enough is collected the group will get a park bench in return. However, even a roadside cleanup, community garden, or planting native trees can help create a greener world. There are so many opportunities to do green projects, talk with your local community and see what opportunities are out there. Be creative and remember to report those projects to LCI.

Next, she talked about Empower Even Greater Good. There are multiple ways we can do this, and many of us are already doing some of these. Collaborating with your district and multiple districts (state) many of our clubs have gotten assistance for individuals in our communities. This is a great way to multiply our ability to help, but the help does not necessarily stop there. If you have a community project look on LCI's webpage and check out grants that are available. Another collaboration is multi-club projects. Just like increasing membership, multi-club projects allow for more help with those bigger activities. Lastly if you are able to as an individual or club, consider donating to LCIF so there continues to be funds available to help with grants and disasters.

Finally, she wanted us to Share Our Story with the World. Marketing is critical to letting the greater community know we are there. It helps with recruitment and also if the public knows what their donations are going to help with, it will hopefully encourage them to continue to donate and possibly give even more. So, remember to post on social media, contact your local newspapers, radio stations, (television if you have it), and don't forget to report your activities to LCI so we can leverage all of our hard work (use the reporting system to help keep track of the number of people you serve and how many hours our members put in).

Again, the forum was a great experience, and a lot was learned, and if we work towards the four steps that IP Dr. Patti Hill laid out for us, we can continue to change the world for the better! I look forward to seeing everyone at the Fall Rally in Grand Island and at the local club visits.

Greetings again from your District Governor!

Hi Lions, I have had a couple of serious emails from International President Dr Patti Hill. First, she was talking about 1.5. For many years we have bragged about global membership of 1.4 million members. Dr. Hill's goal is to achieve membership of 1.5 million members by 2027, four years from now. An LCIF grant allowed improvements which now permit handicapped and elderly individuals to visit and enjoy a park.

In visiting clubs, I learned many things. It has been said "Lions are the best kept secret" as my visits have revealed to me time after time. When I visit clubs, I stay for the regular club meeting. I learn what projects and fundraising events have been held. Lion involvement is revealed.

I see how much Lions are involved in each community. And how the community responds to Lions activities. Surprising and yet sad, we do not hear about these wonderful things happening and the service provided in these communities. Several examples:

Falls City: held a raffle to raise funds for scholarships

Byron: provided funds to help repair a park used by youth

Hordville: Mowing grass in an old rural cemetery

Utica: Dinner and auction to raise funds to purchase an ambulance

What are we able to do in our larger cities, perhaps in a smaller neighborhood which needs a boost? We should learn from each other, and this will only happen when we share our stories.

The other District Governors may have had similar experiences.

LCIF UPDATES

As September comes to an end, close to 30 Nebraska Lions have just returned from the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Reno Nevada. It provided attendees with a wide variety of learning opportunities through seminars designed to expand our personal leadership skills and presented overviews of our Lions International mission and vision.

As MD 38 LCIF chairperson, my primary focus was to attend seminar sessions dedicated to Lions Clubs International (LCIF) and its mission. LCIF is the humanitarian face of Lionism, supporting our mission of service in the eight service areas of vision, hunger, diabetes, disaster relief, environment, youth, childhood cancer, and humanitarian efforts at home and around the world. As Lions we can be proud of this foundation of service, and we should do all we can to support LCIF.

LCIF offers a number of grant opportunities to assist clubs and districts in these various areas of need. Each grant has different guidelines and grant information can be found on the LCI website. One of the primary focuses of the LCIF training seminars was on the District and Club Community Impact grant program. This program is the only one for which a single club can apply. Through the District & Club Community Impact Grants program, 15 percent of a club or district's unrestricted contributions to LCIF are transformed into grants that fund local projects on a club and/or district level. Donations designated directly to LCIF's Empowering Service fund may be made throughout the year, and grants can be applied for in the following Lions year.

The District & Club Community Impact Grant requires a \$5,000 minimum donation for clubs and a \$10,000 minimum donation for districts. The minimum donation must be achieved within the fiscal year (i.e. July 1 – June 30).

Disaster and humanitarian relief efforts remain a high priority as do our efforts to look for more opportunities to provide service and support to our state and local communities. As such, I am urging every club in Nebraska to make a donation to LCIF if they do not already do so. It would be great if MD 38 could become a 100% club donation state. I encourage all club presidents to set an example for its members by making a personal donation. LCIF values the generosity of individual donors. To honor that commitment, the Presidential LCIF Supporter program is being introduced.

This initiative aims to recognize individuals who make an individual contribution to LCIF. There are multiple levels of recognition to honor donors based on their one-time donation amount that meets the eligibility criteria. The levels are as follows: Bronze Pin - US\$50 to US\$99.99; Silver Pin - US\$100 to US\$199.99; Gold Pin - US\$200 and above; Leo-Presidential LCIF Supporter - Minimum donation of US\$20.

100% of donations made to LCIF are used to support grant programs. It's easy to make a donation. Just go to: https://www.lionsclubs.org/en/donate or contact your district LCIF coordinator found in the Who's Who or to me PCC Mavis Hall, MD 38 LCIF coordinator.
